Dear Parents/Legal Guardians,

I hope that you had an enjoyable and restful half term. We have a very busy and exciting half term ahead as we prepare for events such as our visit to Tesco (this Thursday), our class assembly and the Christmas performance of Humph the Camel. Literacy

The children will progress through our Literacy programme – Read Write Inc (RWI), that teaches reading, writing and spelling. They will continue to learn new letter sounds which will help them to become fluent readers. They will explore different genres of writing including narrative and non-fiction, for example, writing instructions.



Maths

Year 1 children will learn: tell the time to the hour and the half hour, measure length, symmetrical patterns, subtraction as 'take away', odd and even numbers, find ½ and ¼ of shapes, doubles, days of the week, months of the year, number bonds of 10 (1+9, 2+8), 2D shapes, use lists and tables to sort objects.

Year 2 children will learn: read time on digital/analogue clocks to the nearest half hour and quarter hour, measure length using centimetres, identify left and right, clockwise and anti-clockwise turns and right angles as quarter turns, add and subtract 10,11 and 20 in the context of money, count in 10's, find halves and quarters of shapes, find doubles to double 20 and related halve, regular and irregular common 2D shapes, use Venn and Carroll diagrams.

Times tables (Y2)

Year 2 children will continue to have a weekly times table test as started last year. This test will be on a **Monday.**

It is important that the children learn these important number facts so that they can become

Reading



In Class One we read in Guided Reading groups. This involves a small group of children taking turns to read from the same book. During these sessions we will analyse a text in detail – discussing new vocabulary, making predictions and ensuring we understand the text.

Please keep your child's reading book and reading record in their book bag each day.

Please support your child at home by reading a little each night. 'Little and often' will help make reading more enjoyable for both you and your child. Please sign and date your child's reading record each time you read.

High frequency words (HFW)

High frequency words (HFW) are often called sight words because they must be memorized by sight. The reason for this is that many HFWs can not be sounded out. These words should be memorized a few at a time, and constantly revisited until your child is able to read, write, and spell them easily.

Learning these words is of huge benefit to your child as it helps them become more **confident** in their reading, it helps their **comprehension** and it provides clues to the **context** of the text.

Please help your child to practice reading the high frequency words which are now in your child's homework book.

Outdoor Learning


