English:

In our English lessons this half term we will be learning how to write

instructions, a character description, information text and an adventure-based story. We will be looking at stories from Greek Mythology and use them as a basis to then write our own descriptions, stories and non-fiction writing.

Reading: We will have reading time every day, where the children will be able to quiz on their reading book and to read to Mrs Thomsen. We will choose our 'class book' and through reading this, we will maintain our positive attitudes to reading and understanding of what we have read.

Spelling: We will continue with our spelling homework each week. While in class we will work on spelling strategies to help us become better spellers and to apply all our learnt spellings consistently into our work.

Punctuation and Grammar: The children worked hard on their spelling and grammar last half term and we will be working on ensuring the learning from the last half term can be applied to all their written work.

Key vocabulary: noun, verb, adjective, adverb, conjunction, time connective, paragraph, fronted adverbial, comma, full stop, brackets, exclamation mark, question mark, speech marks, heading, subheading, first and third person, past and present tense, fiction, non-fiction, subordinate clause, preposition, constant, vowel, dialogue.



Maths:

Please continue to practise all your known times tables weekly, as well as those that will be specifically set for the test every Monday.

Good knowledge and understanding of times tables is a huge part of all maths in Key Stage 2 so please use every spare moment to practice. If rote learning is not working, there are a number of x tables games online and on School 360 such as J2 Times Tables Blast, tutorials and tricks on You Tube as well as songs. We are looking to trial Times Tables Rock Stars and as soon as this has been set up and children have their log ins we will pass this on to you.

Homework will be set using the CGP maths books and can also be developed by using Sumdog regularly at home. This half term we will be consolidating our addition and

subtraction work, work on area and some further written work on multiplication and division.

Key Vocabulary: times tables, multiples, written methods, addition, subtraction, multiply, divide, area, centimetres and cm2.

Computing;



Mrs Chisholm will be teaching computers this half term. In computing this half term, we will be continuing to develop our understanding of digital devices, with an initial focus on inputs, processes, and outputs. We will also compare digital and non-digital devices. Following this, we will be introduced to computer networks, including devices that make up a network's infrastructure, such as wireless access points and switches. The unit concludes with us discovering the benefits of connecting devices in a network.

Key vocabulary for this topic: digital, device, input, process, output, wireless, network, switches, infrastructure



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In History this half term we will be continuing to study The Greeks. We will become Historians and learn all about: Greek life and its impacts, achievements, and influence on the western world.

• Investigate the impact of the Greeks on our society. For

example, Democracy and Olympics

- Learn about the Greek Empire, how it was established and maintained and the impact on the wider world.
- To understand the religious beliefs of the Ancient Greek people and know some of the gods they worshipped.

• Understand how our knowledge of the past is constructed

from a range of sources and that different versions of past

events may exist, giving some reasons for this.

• To know and understand some Ancient Greek Myths.

- recognise that vibrations from sounds travel through a medium to the ear
- find patterns between the pitch of a sound and features of the object that produced it
- find patterns between the volume of a sound and the strength of the vibrations that produced it
- recognise that sounds get fainter as the distance from the sound source increases.

- Maths Our maths homework is paper based and we use the CGP Maths Books. Work will be set each
 Tuesday, to be handed in the following Tuesday. In Year 3 and 4 we place great importance on learning x
 tables so there will be tables set to learn each week and this will be informally tested throughout the week
 during lessons and during the formal test once a week on Mondays. For additional arithmetic practice please
 ensure your child goes on Sumdog Maths.
