When school was only open to staff and key worker children we relied heavily on Class Dojo and Tapestry as ways in which to communicate with one another. Now that families are able to pick up their children at the end of each day please use this time to ask your teacher questions or just have a chat! If you do need to communicate electronically please communicate remember that staff working hours are Monday to Friday 8.30 - 4.00. While staff work much longer hours than this we would love it if you tried not to message outside these times. Also, as all staff are teaching full time they will be unable to respond to messages while the children are in school as they will be teaching and may have meetings after school which mean a response may be delayed. Coming to the classroom door at the end of the day is a great way of getting to know your class teacher and having any questions answered promptly. 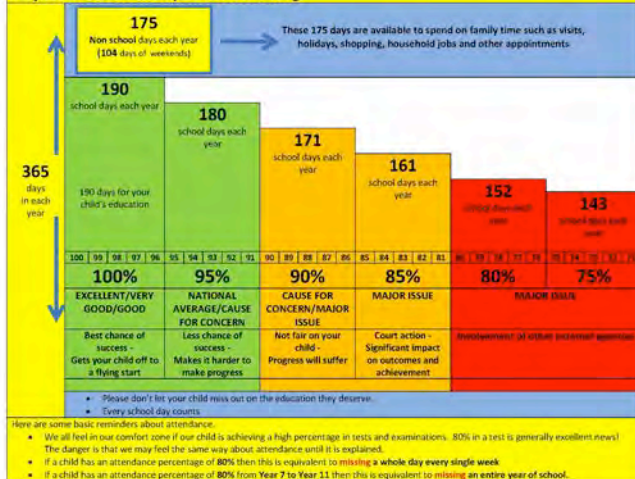
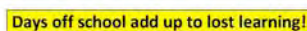
