It was evident from the comments received that our provision for homework matches the needs and capacity of families whilst consolidating the skills and knowledge taught at school. The use of the CGP books for maths homework was highlighted as a welcomed approach as it was stated by those who attended the meeting that written methods could be practised as well as how it enabled parents/ carers to access and support homework - this was something that was identified and acted upon from our previous feedback about homework and so is pleasing to see the impact it is having both in and out of school. A suggestion of having some homework alternate between maths and punctuation & grammar or reading comprehension was made, which is something that we were also looking at too. Many thanks again for your input as it means our school continues to always strive for bettering the outcomes of all children within our school.



NSPCC

Recently, we had NSPCC staff deliver a session to the whole of school about personal safety, welfare and support. Year 5 & 6 also had a further session with NSPCC staff on Thursday to discuss safeguarding and develop our knowledge about abuse and personal safety as well as strategies on where and how to find support. The children were brilliant and gave some fantastic, mature and knowledgeable answers – they were a credit to the school – an opinion also shared by the NSPCC staff that ran the session.

Times Tables Rock Stars

From the moment that we subscribed to TTRS (Times Tables Rock Stars), the children have been very keen to practise their times-tables using this programme. To further support this, we have set weekly 'battles' where the points achieved in any of the TTRS games count towards a total averaged score for each year group. The competition was fierce last week with Year 6 getting the first win; this week was no different and after a few movements on the leader-board, Year 5 have prevailed as the winners of this week's battle.
