### Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

Welcome to the final Headteacher's Blog of a very busy and exciting year which has seen us receive recognition for our excellent teaching and learning through a raft of awards and commendations and a highly successful Ofsted.

We have also been able to greatly improve the learning environment for our children through the new library and group work room and well being space and group work room. The old and energy inefficient windows have been replaced and our outdoor environment including the play equipment, Forest School and Gardening areas maturing and growing mean that our whole school environment continues to be second to none! We have also been able to broaden our children's learning through visits and visitors and social occasions out of school time such as residentials, Movie Nights and Discos!

Improvements planned for over the summer and the new school year ahead are office re-furbishments, door replacements and the first phase of our improvements to our Early Years outdoor area which will be ongoing throughout the Autumn Term as we have plans for a £25,000 improvement project ( of which through grants and donations we already have raised £11,000 although more sponsors and recommendations of ground-workers are very welcome!) I would also like to make the most of staff expertise and purchase new equipment and create a space for 'The Arts' so watch this space!

None of these achievements could have happened if it was not for our school staff team, PTA, Governors, families and most importantly the children themselves so a big thank you to everyone and may I take this opportunity to wish all the children moving on from our school the very best for the future.

Looking ahead to the new school year, we have a training day on Monday 4th September and school re-opens to children on Tuesday 5th September.

We are also really pleased that Mrs Manners has joined our team of Forest School Leaders and will be leading Forest Schools sessions in school for our children as well as leading our Stay and Play Forest Schools Sessions for pre school children once a month! This is something that has been in the planning for the last 18 months so we are so pleased to be able to offer this. ( See poster attached for full details).
