On Monday afternoons Mrs Athey will be delivering either: football, netball, circuit training and fitness or hockey. This will be weather dependent so please ensure that full kit is in school so that I can adapt lessons accordingly To be time effective it would be helpful if children can wear their PE kit of T shirt, grey jogging bottoms, PE hoodie and trainers on Mondays.

In Science / STEM - we will complete our work on animals including humans. The children will be able to explain how humans change from birth to old, understand the circulatory system and the importance of a healthy, balanced diet.

We will then be learning about Light - Understanding that light travels in straight lines. Explain how objects are seen. Describe how shadows are formed. **In Geography** the children will understand geographical similarities and differences in European countries. Firstly, they will learn about the countries of Europe. They will then look in more detail at some of the contrasting areas of



detail at some of the contrasting areas of eastern Europe, finding out about the landscape, climate and locations in each area. Children will bring together their learning about one area of eastern Europe and create information booklets to share what they have found out. The children will find out about Chernobyl and its impact on eastern Europe and the rest of the world.

Reminders:

Homework will continue to be set in the same way as last half term. Children will complete activities set in revision books for English and Maths and this must be returned the following Monday. All homework should be neat and well presented (at the same standard that is expected in class). Homework books should be kept clean; preferably in a plastic wallet. Any lost or damaged books will be charged at the full price plus postage.

Following the success of Sumdog, all children have lo<mark>g in detail</mark>s for games to help their learning in Reading, Writing, Spellings and Maths, which can be completed as extra revision activities.

Please:

- Remember to listen to your child read aloud and sign your child's reading record daily.
- Remember to sign your child's planner weekly. Upcoming events, homework and messages will be recorded in the planner. Parents can also use the planner to send messages to the class teacher. (It will be the child's responsibility to show their teacher if a message has been written.)
