Class 3 Topic Letter Summer Term 1 2022

 Within this half-term, we will continue with our learning and deepening of our maths skills, knowledge and methods as well as take some time to consolidate and refine those that have been taught and learnt. (This is particularly the case for Year 6 who will be prepared for their KS2 SATs test beginning the week of 9th May 2022). Graphs Read, interpret and draw line graphs. Read and interpret bar charts. Read and interpret Venn diagrams and Carrol diagrams. Geometry Read, write and plot coordinates using all 4 quadrants. Calculate missing coordinates. Reflect points and shapes. Translate points and shapes. Use substitution to calculate missing values. Calculate missing values in balanced equations. Use BODMAS to calculate equations. Identify ratios from diagrams and worded questions. Read and write ratios in their expected format. Use identified or given ratios to calculate missing values. Represent ratios in various forms (e.g. diagrams, physical objects, written form). 	In English during this half term, we will be looking at story writing where the children will further develop their descriptive writing, really focussing on the range of sentence structures, punctuation and emotive language choices that they use for effect for the reader. Our next writing focus will be on a persuasive advert where we will look further at emotive language but with a persuasive edge to attract and direct the reader. This, again, will still have a big focus on the range of punctuation and varying our sentence structures as this remains a target for our class as a whole. Finally, for this half-term, we will also be looking at a formal letter of complaint. This will include looking at the tone and authoral voice of our writing and keeping this consistent for impact. The structure of a letter as well as the emotive vocabulary will also be a focus. Key vocabulary: Emotive language, figurative language, introduction, build-up, dilemma, resolution, ending, simile, metaphor, personification, expanded noun phrases, tone, authorial voice, persuasive language, formal, informal.

Music Music For Music for this whole term, we will be looking at musicals. This will begin by first looking at the genre of musicals before then learning, practising and ultimately performing songs within a play to end the year on.

In Geography, we will be studying both the physical geography and human geography of Northumberland over time. This will include the study of local landmarks such as the Cheviots as well as Alnwick town and castle. We will look at the features, climate, topography and location of Alnwick and how this has influenced the use of the land both regionally but also nationally. <u>Key vocabulary:</u>	Our topic this term is Earth and Space. We will learn to: - Describe the movement of the Earth, and other planets, relative to the Sun in the solar system. - Describe the movement of the Moon relative to the Earth - Describe the Sun, Earth and Moon as approximately spherical bodies

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Physical geography, human geography, topography, climate, push and pull factors, migration, trade, agriculture, finance, democracy, population.	 Use the idea of the Earth's rotation to explain day and night and the apparent movement of the sun across the sky. We are very excited to be going on a Science class trip to the Life Centre in Newcastle. Letters will be sent home soon.

Our topics will include: Describing my family, Seasons and Dates, Weather, Where I live.
