An Alternative Learning Space

About 2 and a half years ago I shared with you all that wanted to provide the children with an additional learning space and we were looking at a wooden roundhouse. At the time I discussed this with families and the PTA who agreed to help towards funding this and we had some Primary Sports Funding earmarked for this. Unfortunately the cost of this project was tens of thousands of pounds and an alternative, much cheaper and just as awe inspiring was sourced.( Thank you PTA committee for agreeing to provide £2000, a significant part of the final cost) Our amazing yurt was installed over the half term and pictured are our oldest boy and oldest girl officially opening the yurt. We look forward to all children enjoying this over the next 6 weeks and beyond. Without money raised from the PTA we would not be able to provide our children with those additional extras so please do come to the next meeting and help us with some new ideas for fundraising and events.
