When we hosted the last tournament in the Summer Term we had to use temporary poles as goalposts. We also have re-introduced mixed and girls only football training sessions and purchasing 2 sets would be greatly beneficial.	4 x smaller goals were purchased which enabled an effective tournament with the Aln Alliance Schools to be hosted at Whittingham therefore widening engagement and participation with our Aln Alliance Schools. The children use these extensively at breaktimes and after school. They were well used in PE, with having 4 mini teams and training was possible making the lessons more effective.  Through pupil voice we know that both training sessions were popular. The girls only group have requested that this continues next year and if possible, could we have some matches with other schools.

A significant amount of our Primary Sports Budget over the years has been used to provide further training in PE for our HLTA. This enables her to take PE across the school and work closely with the HT who is also the PE co-ordinator.  Using Primary sports budget enables this to continue and build upon the achievements of the last years.  One area that needs further CPD is dance so the HLTA will work alongside the company for both days and then access any further training afterwards.	The HLTA helped the HT re-plan the whole school PE curriculum and also champion the new PE Scheme Get Set 4 PE. Lessons are now much more effective and there is an impact on skills and attitudes to PE across the school and is something which needs to continue going forwards.  As a school we look to train our staff rather than buy in coaches as we have seen over the past 4 years in particular trained school staff have more impact on standards as they know the children already.  We will however, continue to use Meta 4 Dance in school as a training tool for staff but also as positive role models promoting equality and diversity.
