We continue to have another past pupil training to become a teaching assistant, Abigail Wilkinson. Mrs Maule will be her mentor.

Having a mentor in place means we can support these students whilst maintaining the high standards that we expect.

Attendance and Communication to Staff Unfortunately we are amongst very few schools that have unsatisfactory attendance. This has been noticed by staff, Governors and at Diocesan and County Level . It was therefore a decision made at Summer Term Governors Meeting that anyone under 95 & attendance each half term would receive a standard letter from school. This letter is modelled on a format the Education Welfare Officer has provided. We send this letter out fully aware that your child may have been off for illness and in our records this is recorded as a medical illness and is authorised but still is part of attendance figures and therefore a letter is needed. We look closely at the type of absence so that when the Education Officer visits on a termly basis we can explain fully the situation and then the Education Welfare Officer can make a decision if the matter needs to be taken further.

Please note this a decision that has been made at Governor level and is applied to all pupils. Please remember this when communicating with staff.

As I have mentioned earlier, it was lovely to see notes, cards, emails and positive comments about all the events in school last term. Staff at this school work extremely hard to' go that extra mile' and a smile or kind word of recognition is greatly appreciated. Please be aware if issues arise which you are not happy with contact the class teacher or myself directly in a manner in which you would expect to be spoken to as during the last term some verbal and written communication to staff has been rather unwelcome. Please note I have a school staff to protect and protocol will be followed if staff are communicated with inappropriately. We have a complaints procedure in place. PE and Swimming Provision. We will continue to offer a range of provision in this area. Children in Class 1 will swim this half term and children in Class 2 and 3 will be using specialist equipment in the Sports Hall. Please ensure PE kit is in school during the remainder of the week. Early Years PE provision is provided in school.

As you know we cannot afford to continue to travel to Willowburn without your support.

This half term the contribution towards transport is £12.00 - £2.00 per session for six weeks.

Well done to the pupils who attended the Hockey competition at Shilbottle. We won one of the group competitions! Thank you to parents for transporting children and enabling this event to go ahead and to Mrs Burroughs for organising it.

Bad Weather and School Closure Last term brought the first instance of our closure procedures. Thank you for enabling it to work so well. If we need to close school in the case of bad weather this is the protocol that we will follow. In addition to this, January often brings icy weather so please pay attention to the gritting plan that is fixed to the school gates. We have the children's safety as paramount and pay careful attention to gritting but there may be times when a route as indicated on the plan has been gritted and other areas remain icy. If this occurs in the morning please speak to the member of staff on duty and if you have younger children remember that although we allow children on the school hard from 8.40 Reception and Key Stage 1 children's official school day starts at 8.55a.m. so you are encouraged to stay with them until this time.
