In Literacy we will be developing our Journalistic Writing based around the story 'Tuesday' by David Wiesner. The children will then write their own newspaper reports based on real-life events. We will take part in daily spelling sessions using the Read Write Inc Phonics Spelling scheme. The children will be expected to learn, use and spell correctly all of the spellings from the Years 3,4,5, and 6 spelling lists (copies of which can be found in their planner). This will be tested randomly at points throughout the week and children are expected to spell these words correctly in their everyday work. We will continue to develop our reading comprehension skills through our guided reading sessions and use of Accelerated Reader, as well as increasing understanding of written grammar through writing analysis. Following the success of Sumdog we now have access to a range of English based exercises too, which the children can access at home. In Science / STEM - we will be learning about Light -Understanding that light travels in straight lines. Explain how objects are seen. Describe how shadows are formed.



**In Geography** the children will understand geographical similarities and differences in European countries. Children will bring together their learning about one area of eastern Europe and create information booklets to share what they have found out.



We will then be looking at climate change and green, renewable energy and will find out what happened at the Chernobyl Nuclear Power Plant and its impact on eastern Europe and the rest of the world.

## Reminders:

Homework will continue to be set in the same way as last half term. Children will complete activities set in revision books for English and Maths and this must be returned the following Monday. All homework should be neat and well presented (at the same standard that is expected in class). Homework books should be kept clean; preferably in a plastic wallet. Any lost or damaged books will be charged at the full price plus postage.

Following the success of Sumdog, all children have log in details for games to help their learning in Reading, Writing, Spellings and Maths, which can be completed as extra revision activities.

Please:

- ✓ Remember to listen to your child read aloud and sign your child's reading record daily.
- Remember to sign your child's planner weekly. Upcoming events, homework and messages will be recorded in the planner. Parents can also use the planner to send messages to the class teacher. (It will be the child's responsibility to show their teacher if a message has been written.)

Wellies should be kept in school on pegs for outdoor activities in a clearly named bag. We do not have waterproofs for some of our older children, who are quite tall, so it would be helpful if children could bring in their old waterproofs or ensure they are wearing an old waterproof coat on Fridays.
