<u>The new look continues –</u>

Key Stage 2 Planners-

All children in Key Stage 2 (Years 3, 4 and 5) have been given a marvellous planner to record, events, homework and reminders. These are given to children free of charge but if they are lost or damaged a replacement will need to be paid for at the cost of ± 4.00 .

School Brochure-

The brochure has been updated and is on the new school website (please contact the office if you require a paper copy). However, a new version is currently being created and will be ready later in the term.

School Day

A reminder - to comply with KS 2 teaching requirements children in Years 3, 4 and 5 will be welcomed into school from 8.40 a.m. Teaching for these children starts at 8.45a.m. This enables the younger children to have a morning break before school and prevents the need for different end of day arrangements for children in classes from Reception to Year 5. School for these children ends at **3.15 p.m.** Nursery hours are **9.00 -12.00** (**12.30** pick up if they stay for lunch club). Children who stay all day in Nursery are to be collected from the Early Years Classroom at **3 p.m.** In order to encourage independence children in **Class 3** will be dismissed from the classroom and the class teacher will not necessarily come to the school door. They will be taught about what to do in the event of an adult not being there to pick them up. This will be for the first few weeks and members of staff will be extra vigilant. In addition to that, we always have members of staff outside school at this time. From Spring Term, Mrs Fortescue will follow the same routine with the Year 4 children in her class but we will inform you nearer the time. We feel that this increased independence is extremely important, if the children were to be at Middle School they would be travelling to and from school independently and we need to promote positive independence prior to the children starting Secondary School. For children who live in Whittingham Village those children in Year 5 may wish to start to walk to and from school independently. Whilst this is an important milestone, we need to ensure the children remain safe so I will be discussing the matter with Governors during the Autumn Term and we will let you know once a decision has been made. End of day arrangements -

Please continue the good practice by writing a note or telephoning school with any changes to end of day arrangements.

<u>Site Safety –</u>

Please continue to help us keep children safe by closing gates, not allowing children to run ahead off school premises and parking considerately if using the Village hall car park.

School Dinners

School meals are £2.10 per day. Please could cheques be made payable to Northumberland County Council and in a named envelope, dated with the amount enclosed and what it is for.

Important After School Club News

Before the holidays places were confirmed via text (July 19th 8.38 a.m.- 8.40a.m.) regarding whether your child had a place in book club, KS 2 Football Club, or KS 1 Computing Club. Another text was sent out to inform parents that there was insufficient interest for Thursdays Multi skills (sports and fitness club with Mrs Burrows)and KS 2 computing club and that places were available. Please could you check your texts as they will directly relate to your child as we sent club places confirmation out individually.

At this point in time we still have insufficient interest for KS2 Computing and Multiskills so if you would like a place please could you let school know by Monday morning otherwise we will have to cancel both clubs. Payment is required before clubs start.

In addition to this Mrs Maule will remind all children of their places today.

Family Lunches –

These will continue in the Spring Term.

Tuck Shop and Snack time -

We receive free fruit for children in classes from Nursery to Year 2. Previously when our school was smaller we were able to subsidise this. However, now we are increasing in numbers this is no longer possible. Children in Years 3, 4 and 5 are welcome to bring in their own piece of fruit for snack. I am working with the Year 5 children as part of my Food Technology work on introducing a Healthy Tuck Shop for the older children. The Y5 children will have an enterprise project running the shop, hopefully making a profit from which the children will decide on where the money is spent! Each class will have a turn every half term to cook (starting with Y5) and we will be using specialist facilities in the Village Hall for this purpose. All ingredients and equipment will be provided.

Community Powers

Please be aware that if you have a child in nursery who is not entitled to 30 hours free entitlement we still have our Community Powers Nursery. Please contact school for further details.

Before School / After School Care-

We will be sending a letter out very soon to assess whether there is demand for a daily Breakfast Club and also care after school.

Swimming and PE

As was discussed before the holidays. Nursery and Reception do not go to Willowburn for swimming or PE at this time.

Class 1 will swim this half term.

Class 2 will use the specialist facilities for PE at Willowburn.

Please note there will be a cost involved for transport as PTA will no longer be subsidising transport. School continues to use the Primary Sports Funding Grant for the cost of hall hire and lessons.

The contribution per week is £2.00.
