Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

Welcome to the Headteacher's Blog of the week. I hope you managed to have some time together over half term and it is wonderful to see the children back and continuing their hard work. The full roof replacement in our outdoor stone outbuilding should be complete by the end of the day and as soon as the skip and fencing are away we will be able to return to using the main gate.
