SPaG focus We will look closely at the punctuation and grammar associated with our writing genre for this half term.

We will read and write a playscript

Text used will be: A variety of texts including school plays/performance

We will also read and write humorous and performance poetry from a variety of sources.

Every morning the children will complete a range of activities including spelling practice, handwriting, comprehension and reading.

Please remember to read with your child on a regular basis and talk about the story. What is happening? Why did that character say what they did? What do you think will happen next? What does that word mean? How do you think the character is feeling?

Talking about the books is really important to develop a deeper understanding of the text.

Science - Plants

During this topic we will learn the following and work scientifically to investigate these objectives

- Identify and describe the functions of different parts of flowering plants: roots, stem, leaves and flowers.
- Explore the requirements of plants for life and growth (air, light, water, nutrients from soil, and room to grow) and how they vary from plant to plant.
- Investigate the way in which water is transported within plants.
- Explore the part that flowers play in the life cycle of flowering plants, including pollination, seed formation and seed dispersal.

structure, flowering plants, roots, stem/trunk, leaves, flowers function nutrition, support, reproduction, makes its own food requirements for life and growth air, light, water, nutrients from the soil, room to grow needs vary, fertiliser life cycle flowers pollination, seed, formation, seed dispersal

History - The Vikings: ruthless killers or peaceful settlers?

During this topic we will learn about the following

- Viking raids and invasion - To understand the Viking and Anglo-Saxon struggle for the Kingdom of England to the time of Edward the Confessor.
- What did the Vikings want and how did Alfred help to stop them getting it?
- What was the 'terror' that appeared in Britain on June 8th 793?
- Why was the design of their longships so important to the Vikings?
- Understand the role of archaeologists in uncovering remains and how the past can be pieced together and how recent findings have changed our perception of the Vikings.

R.E - Christianity

We use the Northumberland County Council Agreed Syllabus for Religious Education and this half term we will be asking

What sort of world did Jesus want?

When answering this question we will identify texts that come from a Gospel and tell the story of Jesus and his teachings

Make clear links between the calling of the disciples and how Christians today try to follow Jesus and be the fishers of people
Suggest ideas and then find out Jesus' actions towards outcasts and what that means for a Christian

Give examples of how Christians show love/care including how church leaders try to follow Jesus' teachings

PSHE

This half term we will be considering the importance of friendships and what makes a healthy friendship. We will also be challenging negative thinking as well as learning about respecting ourselves and others. Some of these themes will be covered in Forest School activities with Mrs Chisholm.

French - Shapes and Seasons

In the shape unit the children will learn 10 common shapes and also recap the numbers 1-5. By the end of the unit pupils will be able to recognise, recall, remember and spell up to ten shape nouns with their indefinite article.

In the seasons unit pupils will learn the 4 seasons of the year along with a key feature for each season in French. By the end of the unit pupils will have the skills and knowledge to say which is their favourite season and why
