## Health reminders.

Please ensure you continue to follow government guidelines and social distancing measures, especially if your child is coming into school as it is important that we can keep children and staff as safe as possible. In the unlikely event that you are unable to get a test straight away please keep your child off school for a minimum of 7 days as this is still the NHS guidance.

### Key Worker Provision.

Please be reminded that our key worker provision is for families during their days of work or to cover shift patterns. A full time place should only be taken if full time hours are worked. This enables us to provide structured provision for these children as well as keeping spaces open for other families in need. This also enables us to provide places for up to 8 Nursery and Reception children and part time places for Year 1 children at this time. If there are changes to shifts please let me know as soon as possible, preferably by the Wednesday before the following week so that the staff rota can be set and planning put in place. Please note that I cannot quarantee to pick up messages over the weekend and this also does not enable me to give staff adequate notice to plan for the week ahead.
