involved in an exciting project led by James Tait and Bailiffgate Museum, this will invove the children writing their own legends using local dialect words which will eventually be developed into our Summer show.


Homework: The homework books are working well and overall the children are well motivated to complete these. Thank you for your assistance in helping us to ensure that all pupils are the best they can be. The children will now also be bringing weekly spellings home, we are learning these in school but the children are also expected to learn these at home and then to apply these spellings correctly in their independent work. There will be a test on a Monday. Daily reading with your child is also important. In Numeracy your child will be deepening their understanding of multiplication, division and fractions. They will also be learning about length, perimeter and area. It is very




important that children learn their times tables as they are vital to making progress in maths now and through Secondary school. This academic year the Government will be testing all Y4 children on their times tables (June 2020).

Remember to help your child to learn their times tables they can use Sumdog at home as there is a specific section for times tables practice. The children seem to be enjoying their homework booklets and I have also had positive feedback from parents. Thank you for your continued support at home with this.

Art and Design

The children will learn about Andy Goldsworthy who creates works of art using the natural environment. The children will be able to design and create their own sculptures using materials found in the environment.

The children will compare and group rocks based on their appearance and simple physical properties. They will also learn how fossils are formed and recognise that soil is made from rock and organic matter

Reminders:

Please:

- Remember to listen to your child read aloud and sign your child's reading record daily
- Remember to sign your child's planner. Upcoming events, homework and messages will be recorded in the planner. Parents can also use the planner to send messages to the class teacher, it will be the child's responsibility to show their teacher if a message has been
- Football boots and shin pads to be brought into school on Mondays and Fridays as the football lesson may be weather dependent.
