Team Whittingham Success!

Four young riders have just returned from the national schools equestrian association championships held at addington equestrian centre in Buckingham riding for Whittingham CofE Primary School.

This national event which invites schools from all over the UK to compete in various qualifiers over the past 12 months had over 1000 ponies along with their riders compete over the four days to contest the finals.

Ellie Gray 11, Sam Herdman 11, Poppy Dods 11 and Frankie Herdman, 10 qualified for this event earlier in the year at two events in the Scottish Borders.

The children represented Whittingham School in four different classes over two days. They came 4th out of 37 teams in the 70cm show jumping event. Poppy came 9th individually and Frankie 18th out of 71 riders.

The team came 3rd out of 24 teams in the 75cm jumping with style event. A course of up to 20 coloured and rustic jumps.

In the 85cm jumping with style they finished in 21st place out of 35 teams. In this event they finished on zero penalties but placings came down to time as it was such a competitive event.

The fourth class they competed in was the 85cm showjumping. Again the team rode super to finish on zero faults and finished in 11th place out of 45 Teams. Its a phenomenal achievement for a small school like Whittingham to be represented at national level in any sport and school is exceptionally proud of these results. Three of the team have now moved onto high school where it is hoped to establish a new Duchess team. Whittingham has many keen young riders so it is hoped a new team will be formed for next year too.
