Class 2 and Class 3 were fortunate enough to have a trip to the Newcastle Hindu Temple and the Newcastle Cathedral in their first week back into thus half-term. Our first place of worship was the Hindu Temple.

RE trip

After removing our shoes at the door of the Mandir, we had a talk from Pandit Ji who explained what Hinduism is and some of the different forms of God. We learnt about the importance of a bell in Hindu prayer and the significance of chanting 'Om'. We also got to look around the Hindu Temple and were told about how Hindus live their lives. Finally, Pandit Ji led a Hindu prayer.





At Newcastle Cathedral, we were met by Cathedral Education staff who took us on a guided tour. She explained about the history of different sections of the building as well as how the cathedral was used in different era of time. Different aspects of the church were explained too, including the coats of arms that could be seen, ledger stones, the font, the altar and the crypt. Class 3 also took part in a Eucharist service as the observation of this will link to future lessons.
