organised such a fantastic Easter Bingo last Friday. Great fun was had by all and a good deal of money was raised (amounts will be verified and shared at the next PTA meeting). Thank you for the generous donations of prizes and to everyone who attended.

Swimming and PE in KS 2 will be sending a email out today regarding swimming and PE at Willowburn. For KS 2 all their PE provision will be on a Tuesday afternoon. The vast majority of children will swim, with some children using the facilities in the sports hall. This provision is going to cost school around £8.00 per pupil (including transport alone being £160 per week) with 50% being funded by the Primary Sports Budget. For the first time in many years we will be asking for a weekly contribution of £3.50 on School Money. If you have any issues or worries about payments please do not hesitate to contact me directly.

#### After School Clubs

Clubs have become much more popular over the last half term and therefore I can confirm that they will continue to run after Easter. Costs will remain the same. After feedback from the girls in classes 2 and 3 I am looking to see where I can fit in a KS2 airls football club and as soon as I have worked on this I will let you know. In the meantime, to confirm:

Mondays after school club and wrap around care (3.15 - 5.30) Multisports. Tuesdays after school club and wrap around care (3.15-5.30) Arts and Crafts. Wednesdays - KS2 children (limited to 8 children) Gardening, with some Forest Schools elements- 3.15-5.15. Please note this is not a drop in club and if children wish to attend we expect them to attend every session or they will forfeit their place.

For ease, we will assume the same children are attending clubs on the same days as oreviously unless you let us know differently.

If your child is new to clubs please email or ring the office to book a place. Clubs continue to be charged on a half termly basis. Please ensure your child is picked up promptly. If you are not picking your child up at 4.15 or 5.30 it would be really helpful to et us know when we can expect them to be picked up as the children may be outside or in the hall where the front door buzzer is not audible.

# CLOTHING SWAP




