Northumberland's Family Hubs have launched a new free app to help parents give their child the best start in life.

The Family Hub Northumberland app features top tips and ideas for fun everyday activities, such as songs to sing and games to play, that can support children's early learning and development, preparing them to be ready for school.

Developed together with Northumberland County Council's Early Years Team, parents and carers, it also gives easy access to the full offer of Family Hub support – including links to the popular what's on activity guides, Dad's Pad and free online parenting and relationship advice.

Videos have been hand selected from the BBC's Tiny Happy People website, to support families in the areas we know children often require the greatest support in. The cornerstone of each activity is playing and spending quality time whilst bonding with your child. The best part is this is all absolutely free. No payments, subscriptions, or in-app purchases. Just a straightforward tool with practical advice created to help you support your child's learning in everyday life.

Early Help Systems Guide Event

Every year, we are required by the Department for Education (DfE) to carry out two self-assessments about our early help system, and our approach to reducing parental conflict, to measure our progress in providing better support to children, young people and their families right across all services in Northumberland.

Partners assess progress and determine actions to build upon the support in place for children, young people and their families.

Partners from Family Help, Health, Education, Northumberland Adolescent Services and Family Hubs attended a carousel style event and spent time discussing the significant progress Northumberland is making and what is still left to be done.

The event was very successful with a lot of great discussion.

We are required to submit both self-assessment early in July.





Northumberland Breastfeeding Friendly Scheme

Northumberland County Council and Northumberland Family Hubs encourage hospitality businesses and venues across the county to register for the Breastfeeding Friendly Scheme, to show support to breastfeeding mothers.

Flexible support is available to mothers, fathers and significant others during pregnancy and/or up to your child is 2 years old.

Free childcare extends to children over 9 months- apply now

Eligible working parents in Northumberland can now apply for 15 hours childcare for a child aged 9 months old and over.

It's the latest stage in the rollout of the Government's expansion to childcare support for families.

Infant Feeding Team

We continue to work with the Family Hub team to offer Infant Feeding Support. Recently we have extended our outreach service, using venues such as, library hubs, in response to requests for more accessible sessions.

Virtual Weaning

For parents/carers of babies from 3 months, we offer a virtual session on when to introduce solids and how which is co-delivered by 0-19 Practitioner and Family Hub practitioners. The sessions also cover oral health and what to do if baby chokes.

Parents/carers can book onto the session via 0-19 Single Point of Contact, SPOC phone number 0300 737 2488 and they will be sent a link to join the session. These occurs twice monthly on a Monday or Friday.

Support for Young Dads with 'North-East Young Dads and Lads'
