Retirement of our Vice Chair of Governors and a new Parent Governor - After a number of years supporting our school in her role as Vice Chair of Governors I would like to wish Mrs Janet Young all the best on her retirement of this role. Following 2 vacancies of Parent Governors I am pleased to announce that Mrs Clare Frater is now a Parent Governor. We still have a co-opted governor and parent governor vacancy so if you are interested or know of someone who is interested.

Attendance – Our termly attendance checks and letters went out this week. We understand that children need to be off when unwell to give them time to recover and to also stop the spread of illnesses. However, this has been the worst autumn term for a number of years where children have been taken out for days out and holidays. While it is not our schools' current practice to fine families this is against advice of our Local Authority who monitor our attendance and we may be forced to fine families, especially if holidays or days out happen on more than one occasion. We also use money from our budget to provide support and interventions for children and if they have 2 terms of repeated attendance under our school target of 96% this support may be withdrawn and allocated elsewhere.

If your child is going to be off school on holiday and you want extra work for them your class teacher will not provide extra work, instead:

- Get books to read from your local library to take and try and keep up with reading while you are away.
- Create a travel diary of writing and pictures that your child can share with their class on their return.

If your child has attendance less than 96% for two terms we are obliged to inform the Education Welfare Officer.
