Reminders

Dear Parents, Carers and Friends,

Thank you for your continued support as we have returned to having multiple cases of COVID in school this week. As of today the guidelines for absence due to COVID have changed and can be found here:

Updated guidance will advise (and at our school we are following):

Adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature.

Children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend.

If any families are still able to test:

Adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious.

For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days.

As the cases in school are currently relatively high we will continue to ask families who pass the main school gate to pick up their children to continue to wear a face covering and all being well this will no longer be in effect from Monday 27th April 2022. We also ask all children to return to full school uniform on this date.

As always, please do not hesitate to speak to your child's class teacher or myself or Mr Charlton if you have any queries, concerns or ways in which to make our school even better.
